Policies for all 6th grade classes:

- Planners The school provides assignment books to all students for the purpose of keeping track of assignments.

 Since a great deal of parent/teacher communication is generated through the Planner, we strongly encourage you to read and sign these daily. Assignment books allow parents to see homework assigned and any teacher notes.
- > **Grades and Attendance** The sixth grade teachers will use the school computer system, Infinite Campus, to input grades at least every two weeks. Paper copies of progress reports will not be sent home with your son/daughter. If you do not have access to a computer, if you do not know your password, or if you would like a paper copy of your son/daughter's updated progress, please contact the Middle School Office at 734-269-2220.
- > **Homework** Late assignments will receive a reduced grade. Assignments turned in one day late will be reduced 10%, two days late will be reduced 50%, and a zero will be given after that. This policy will also apply should we go to online learning.
- Absent Work If a student is absent, it is his/her responsibility to check Google Classroom and complete any tasks that may be assigned. Not all work will be available on Google Classroom. When students return to school, they should ask for and complete any additional classwork and assignments missed during the absence.
- > Homework Help Teachers are available to answer students' homework questions from 7:45-8:00 AM, during Skills Seminar, and immediately after school before students leave for the day.

Sixth Grade Classroom Rules

Come to class **prepared**. Bring all materials to your classes. Bring a book to read if you finish work early. Listen and follow directions.

Raise your hand to respond to discussions and ask questions.

Respect others and their property.

Mode of Communication: My main mode of communication with the students will be Google Classroom. My email address is merkel@idaschools.org. Parents/Guardians can contact me with any questions regarding their child's learning. Curriculum: In Sixth Grade English, we will practice communication skills. These skills include reading, writing, speaking, and listening and building vocabulary. We will practice writing narrative, expository, and argumentative, and many smaller pieces throughout the year. Students will also explore prefix, suffix and root word meanings.

Modes of Instruction: All weekly agendas will be posted on Google Classroom on Monday. If a student is out of the classroom for an extended period of time, I will arrange for some of the work to be posted on Google Classroom or picked up in the office. No Red Ink will be used for supplemental grammar practice for many homework assignments.

Classroom Management: I will be implementing a "Teams and Themes" approach to classroom management this year. Each class will be put into teams of four with various roles for each team member. The teams will be competing for points for a 9-week period. At the end of 9 weeks, the two teams with the most points will be awarded coupon books that can be used in the classroom. At no time will I award or subtract points on individual grades. At the start of the second marking period, everyone on the two teams with the most points will be team leaders of their own teams. I have two major themes in my classroom: respect and responsibility. I feel every violation of classroom expectations will fall under one of these categories. I will issue two warnings that a student violated a theme of class. On the second warning, their name will go in my book and a call will be made home. On the third warning, the student will be expected to write a 3-paragraph essay outlining the theme, how they went wrong and how they will improve their behavior. This essay will be reviewed, corrected for mistakes and returned to the student for correction. I will not accept an essay as complete until there are three or fewer mistakes.

I look forward to working with your child this year. My focus will always be to try and understand what is best for him or her. Curriculum and Required Materials

- The curriculum for 6th grade Social Studies is aligned with the Michigan Department of Education's Content Standards for Social Studies.
- The social studies curriculum is a geography-based course which introduces students to the physical and human geography of the world. Beginning with a spatial way of thinking, students will explore a variety of thematic maps to illustrate how the earth is represented, the tools of geography, along with the Geographic Inquiry process to answer geography related questions. Students will examine a variety of global issues that come from human activities such as population change, migration, urbanization, resource use, globalization and economic interdependence, and the interactions among nations. Furthermore, students will explore how humans have used, adapted, or modified their environment and the consequences of those actions.

➤ Grades will be updated using Infinite Campus. You should monitor your child's grades by logging into their account. If you do not know your password, please contact the Middle School Office at (734) 269-2220. Be aware, Infinite Campus is a new program this year that will be taking the place of Home Access Center. Not all assignments will be graded, and many will be self-checked (with the exceptions of test). All homework assignments are worth 5 points and test are worth 10. It is set up like this to help prevent dishonesty on homework assignments. For example, if you get a 100% on your homework but fail the quiz your grade will reflect the fact that you truly do not understand the concept for whatever reason. Please don't let this intimidate you. I am here to help. If you put in the effort and do your own work, you will be successful! I promise. Students in the past have really liked the points system that I use. It allows for mistakes to be made on the homework without a major drop in your grade. See the example below and let me or your child know if you have any questions. It will be explained to them in class.

Grades: Infinite Campus

Curriculum:

Science- In sixth grade at Ida, we study all the Michigan Middle School Life Science Standards (Ecosystems, Body Systems, Cells, Heredity, Adaptations and Survival, Investigations, Communication)

Skills Seminar (Semester class for those not in band) – We study science skills – informational reading, writing, scientific method, metric system, and investigations.

<u>Assessments</u>: Both formative and summative assessments will be given. Formative are grades given for assignments, activities, and quizzes that guide learning toward the goal. Summative grades are activities, tests, and projects that show if the concepts and skills have been mastered.

Student Responsibilities

- Check Planner/Google Classroom daily. Read all assignment directions.
- Complete your assigned work by the due date.
- Study vocabulary and concepts as they are learned and review them often so that you are prepared when a test comes.
- Please don't get stressed. Ask clarifying questions when you need help or don't understand.
- Be respectful to yourself, teachers and peers.

Parent/Caregiver/ Family Responsibilities

- Help students establish and follow regular daily routines
- Review work assigned to the student. Encourage them to tell you about what they are learning.
- Encourage students to **get enough sleep**. Keep regular bedtimes.
- Set sensible time limits for technology use. I suggest making sure there is No Access to technology during the night.
- Please don't get stressed. Communicate with me if you or your child is struggling.
