Traffic flowUpdates and Reminders

Elementary school

Pick up and drop off

All elementary parents are to utilize the new drive. The new drive is one way only and consist of two lanes. Traffic is to enter from Ida East proceed to drop off/pick up point at the elementary and exit Ida Street.

There are two sets of gates. One set of gates is by the road (Ida East) and the other set of gates is by the school. The gates at Ida East will be closed every day from 8:30 am to 2:00 pm. The gates by the school will be closed from 8:30 am to 2:55 pm. Please be sure to have your pick up tag visible.

Middle School

Pick up and drop off

All middle school and high school traffic that is coming from the north on Lewis Avenue must use Ida Street to enter school grounds. Any middle school and high school traffic coming from the south on Lewis must use Firestone Drive. All middle and high school parents are to use the loop to drop off and pick up their student(s) in front of the school. No students are to be dropped off around the back of the shop or over by the high school band room.

High School

Pick up and drop off

All middle and high school parents are to use the loop to drop off and pick up their student(s) in front of the middle school.

Student Parking

High school students coming from the north on Lewis are to come down Ida Street all the way to the elementary and then go to the left of the island then to student parking. They are to exit the same way. High school students coming from the south on Lewis are to enter and exit school grounds through Firestone Drive.

Visitor parking

Please do not park in the parking spots directly in front of the building on the south side of Firestone Dr. before school begins. This lane is needed for bus movement between buildings. If you do need to visit the high school building, including central office, please use the parking spots on the north edge of the parking lot facing the fence.

New at IES for the 2025-2026 School Year!

This year we are asking every student to have a color coded "Dismissal Tag" attached to the top handle of each students' bookbag.

Dismissal Tags can be picked up by filling out a form and bringing it to the Elementary Office. You will need to know your child's or children's drop off location and mode of transportation.



Curbside Students

BLUE ID TAGS

Students whose parents stay in their vehicle; Staff will assist child to the proper vehicle. Curbside pick up time is between 3:00 – 3:15pm.

Parents will drive their vehicle through one of our two curbside lines, following the attached map route.

Parents will make sure the curbside tag number is visible to our staff.

Staff member will open the vehicle door to assist your child.

**PARENTS - you will need to register for a numbered Curbside Tag at the Elementary Office.





Bussed Students

YELLOW ID TAGS

Students who are riding a bus home at the end of the day. **PARENTS – you must have arranged this with our Transportation Office to secure your child being placed on a bus. Please call (734) 269–9003
Ext. #4001 or #4003.



Walking Students

ORANGE ID TAGS

Students who live locally and walk home, or students who have a parent that work in one of our other buildings and the student walks to their parent.

Your child will go to our "walkers" area.

Your child will wait until all walkers have gathered. Walking students will be dismissed at one time.



Parent Pick Up Students

PURPLE ID TAGS

Students whose parents park their vehicle and come to main entrance to pick up their child. Pick up time is between 3:00 - 3:15pm.

Parents bring their numbered parent pick up tag with them to pick up their child.

Make sure the numbered parent pick up tag is visible to our staff at dismissal time.

**PARENTS – you will need to register for a numbered Parent Pick Up Tag at the Elementary Office.

Save Time!

Come to the Elementary Office BEFORE open house to avoid long lines to receive dismissal (bookbag) tags and pickup/car (parent) tags!

August 18th through August 25th from 7:30am to 3:00pm.

Updates from Ida Elementary

Ida Elementary School (IES) is proud to be a PBIS (Positive Behavior and Intervention Supports) school. IES is committed to recognizing and reinforcing excellent behavior and correcting negative behaviors with support, reteaching, and partnering with families to support the character and behavior needs of our students.

The first few weeks of school, students learn our building-wide expectations and will have opportunities throughout the year to practice and grow in these expectations. We encourage you to reinforce these same expectations at home, so we can partner together!

When behavior issues do arise, our staff follows our school-wide behavior flow chart that outlines interventions and consequences. When teachers use the flowchart interventions and they are unsuccessful, an Office Discipline Referral is entered and tracked.

To ensure we partner with families, teachers or administrators will contact parents through email, phone, or Bloomz when these types of events occur. Administrators determine the next steps that best suit the situation and behavior. To ensure the safety of each student, details about the students involved will never be disclosed or discussed outside of the MTSS Behavior team and involved IES Staff Members.

We approach behavior interventions in a similar way to academic interventions. As a team we search for the cause of the behavior and implement interventions to support the student. PBIS is a reinforcement and consequence based system. As a community we see the need to move away from reactive punishments and a move toward restoring relationships and supporting the growth of students in a positive direction. We can't embark on this mission alone. We look forward to teaching your family about PBIS and the importance it has in both the school and home setting. Thank you for your partnership.

Time for Lunch! Food Service Updates

Breakfast will be served in each building

- Elementary 8:00am (delivered to the classroom)
- Middle and High school breakfast 7:45am 8:00am in the cafeteria. Students may go directly to the cafeteria once the building opens.

Lunch

- Ala Carte will be available, as usual in the Middle and High school during lunch times.
- If your child packs his/her lunch, milk will be offered for .50.

If a doctor has determined that your child has a disability, and the disability would prevent the participant from eating the regular school meals, we will

make reasonable substitutions to the meals for students who are considered to have a disability or medical need that restricts their diet. This is done on a case-by-case basis. A doctor's statement, including prescribed diet and/or substitution, must be submitted to the food service department of the school. The Dietary/Allergy form may be obtained on the school website, in the school front office, or the food service deptartment. We will provide building lunch menus as usual. These can be found on the school website under the specified building. An elementary breakfast menu will also be provided.

BE IN THE KNOW WHEN IT COMES TO TRANSPORTATION

Bus Stop Facts:

- 1. Only the transportation supervisor can assign or move bus stops.
- 2. Students are limited to two pick up or drop off locations.
- 3. Dress for the weather: students need to be out and ready five minutes prior to their scheduled pick up time.
- 4. Stay off the road at all times while walking to or waiting for the school bus.
- 5. Line up single file off the roadway while waiting to board.
- 6. Wait till the driver has signaled you to cross the road.
- 7. Cross 10 feet in front of the bus.

Bus Rules:

- 1. Remain seated and out of the aisle while the bus is in motion.
- 2. Keep all body parts inside the school bus at all times.
- 3. No eating or drinking on the school bus.
- 4. No littering or throwing items around the bus.
- 5. Keep books, book bags, packages, coats and all other items out of the aisle.
- 6. No taking pictures or videos; no sharing videos or games with other students.
- 7. No fighting or bullying.
- 8. No destruction of property.


