<u>Teacher/Parent Communication</u>: I will make myself available through email, phone call, and zoom. I will do my best to communicate within 24 hours. Email: <u>fox@idaschools.org</u>

**Teacher/Student Communication:** Students will be participating with me on zoom.

<u>Virtual Learning</u>: Zoom – All students will be provided a zoom link to attend virtual reading support. In order to provide support but keep groups low, support will be provided twice a week. Reading Programs that will be used include, but are not limited to, Tumblebooks, Reading Street, Starfall, and iRead. Zoom times will be arranged with the parent based on availability – taking into consideration; time of classroom teacher instruction, parent/care giver availability to put student on zoom, and appropriate groupings of peers.

<u>Modes of Instruction</u>: Zoom will be used with most students. If a student is unable to zoom, instruction will be made through phone calls.

<u>Materials Needed</u>: Electronic device, positive attitude

**Formative Assessments**: The grade level Dibel/Acadience assessment will be used monthly.
