Homework/Homework Policy:

Students are expected to complete any incomplete assignments at home. We will have time in class to work on assignments, so

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there should not be too much homework. Homework problems in the Big Ideas curriculum varies per assignment. Approximately from 15 to 25 problems per day. Students should have the assignments documented in their planner, please check the planner nightly and verify that the assignments are completed. Check your students' grade book weekly on the home access center. I will send the homework schedule weekly via email. Most math sections will be over 2 or 3 days therefore there will be some time in class for homework. Therefore, there should be a relatively small number of homework problems to be done at home most days. (Only the ones not completed in class)

Homework grading:

Each assignment will be worth 10 points.

5 points for completion on time. Each day late will be -1 point.

5 points 90-100% correct

4 points 80-89% correct

3 points 70-79% correct

2 points 60-69% correct

1 point 50-59% correct

All homework assignments students will be able to correct up to 5 problems for full credit.

Quizzes and Tests will be graded by percent score. Students will be able to correct students will be able to correct up to 5 problems for full credit on these assignments.

Academic Integrity:

Academic integrity is expected on all assignments. Cheating on an assignment or assessment or other activity violates school rules. Any work that exhibits cheating will result in a zero, parental notification, and disciplinary action may be taken.

Absences:

It is the student's responsibility to complete missed handouts/assignment. When a student is absent, they are responsible for completing the assignment for those absences. This includes daily assignments, quizzes and exams. In the event of an extended absence, personal arrangements may be made. Quarantine students are expected to keep up on assignments.
