

Our class will consist of the following tasks:



- Free Write (F.W.): silent, timed daily writing practice
- **Genre Work:** Narrative (MP1), Argumentative (MP2), Research (MP3), Multigenre (MP4)
- Assessment(s): "Best Draft" Essays and Writing Portfolio

Late Work Policy

Once I check an assignment and upload the grade to Infinite campus, I will email students and parents stating that new scores have been added. Students will have a week after receiving my email to make up a missing assignment or redo and resubmit a low-scoring assignment. After one week, that missing assignment will remain a zero. And students will NOT get another opportunity to resubmit.

Restroom Policy

Absence Policy ()

Plagiarism is the practice of using or copying someone else's idea or work and pretending you thought of it or created it.

In this class, plagiarism includes . . .

turning in another's **work** as one's own.



copying any part of another student's work before class, during class, or while in another class.



copying an author's exact words without quotation marks and/or citation and pretending they are one's own. Note: author includes all writers of content that can be found on the Internet.

Students caught plagiarizing will be given a **ZERO** for the assignment and receive an administrative referral.

Chromebook
