## Curriculum and Required Materials

$>$ The curriculum for 6th grade Social Studies is aligned with the Michigan Department of Education's Content Standards for Social Studies.
$>$ The social studies curriculum is a geography-based course which introduces students to the physical and human geography of the world. Beginning with a spatial way of thinking, students will explore a variety of thematic maps to illustrate how the earth is represented, the tools of geography, along with the Geographic Inquiry process to answer geography related questions. Students will examine a variety of global issues that come from human activities such as population change, migration, urbanization, resource use, globalization and economic interdependence, and the interactions among nations. Furthermore, students will explore how humans have used, adapted, or modified their environment and the consequences of those actions.
